Appendix 1

Calculation of BC&S Precept Demand

What is the Tax base? Council tax is the way that an area's residents contribute towards the cost of local services. There needs to be a mechanism for sharing this cost equitably across residents, in order to determine the level of their council tax bills. This mechanism is the total number of properties in the area, adjusted to reflect:

- · relative property values (by allocating each property to one of 8 valuation Bands, A H); and
- · estimates for any exemptions from council tax or discounts that those properties may attract, as well as any Local Council Tax Reduction Support awarded to the occupants. The resultant figure is called the Tax base, and it is expressed in terms of the total number of "Band D Equivalent" properties in each area.

How the Tax base is calculated: The way that the Tax base is calculated is set out by legislation, so is the same process for all councils. Billing authorities are statutorily responsible for setting the Tax base in their areas, so this is done by West Suffolk Council. The starting point is the annual government "CTB return" completed by ARP (Anglia Revenues Partnership), who are responsible for raising the bills and collecting the council tax on our behalf. They begin with information on the Valuation List as at 9 September 2023 which lists the actual number of properties in each Parish or Town by valuation band. Subsequent lines on the return adjust these figures for all the various exemptions, discounts and council tax reduction support that apply as at 7 October 2023. The resulting total properties in each valuation band are then converted to a band D equivalent by applying factors that are set to ensure that a band A property will pay 2/3 of a band D property bill, whilst a band H property will pay twice as much as a band D (and 3 times that of a band A). These "band D equivalents" are then added together to give the Tax base for the purpose of the CTB return.

The problem is, as I see it is that there is approximately 300 to 400ing hundred yards of ditch, a good deal of which is over grown, which stretches from Chapel road down the side of Smithy Close, all the way along the side of the allotments at the back of Smithy Close, round the back of the houses facing the Green nearly to Bury road.

In reality there will always be vermin along a stretch like this, the pest control guy said yesterday that he can only control them it is not possible to totally eradicate them.

My suggestion would be to not take any further action at this stage, until this current activity is complete and we can review the results. I would be very happy to report back at the next PC meeting and update on the recommendations from Command.

Thanks for your email. I think the PC will have to pay for another treatment further up the ditch given there is another infestation, otherwise, the rats will multiply and return to the current site. Apart from this, there is a public health issue if the PC does not do anything

Nicola, I think we will have to send a note to all residents in Smithy Close not to feed the birds on or near the ditch, as the PC will not bear the cost of another extermination treatment.

Clive would you ask the company to do the necessary treatment in the other area asap, so it can then do the second and third treatments at the same time as the treatment carried out today, and so do the second area at the same cost of £122.00 plus VAT.

Hi Tony and Nicola

Here is an update on the Allotment rat situation:-

The person from Command Pest control came out today.

He has placed three bait boxes in the ditch behind No's 8 and 9 Smithy close. I had cleared this area over the weekend in anticipation of his visit, this area was very over grown as is the rest of the ditch. He has also placed another bait box behind some compost bins (my father in laws) and another in the garden of No8 (his property.)

Command will make two further visits over the next month to top up the bait boxes and ensure they are placed correctly. The total cost for this service is £120 + VAT.

The invoice is not sent until the final visit is made, I have requested the invoice be made out to the Parish Council and sent care of myself, I will then let you have it for payment, hope this is OK.

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Whilst, I was clearing part of the ditch on Saturday, I spoke with another allotment holder who has a plot at the far end of the allotments, a good 50 yards further along the ditch, and enquired as to whether he was having any issues with Rats. His was response was indeed he is, and has taken some measures to try and eradicate the problem, with little effect.

I suspect, and this is only my opinion, that over the last few years most of the "older village folk" who used to keep an allotment took their own measures to control vermin, however, as they have grown older and given up their allotments or lost the ability to set the traps the problem has grown.
