

All Saints Church is a Grade II* listed building in the parish of Bradfield Combust With Stanningfield on the A134 Roman road 5 miles from Bury St Edmunds. A medieval church founded in 1538, it comprises a C13 triplearch nave, chancel, south aisle, north vestry and south timber porch (added in 1861). Constructed of flint rubble, freestone dressings, bands of red brick and a plain-tiled roof, the

church was restored in 1869; alterations included the reconstruction of the east chancel wall with 3-light windows (in mid - C14 style) and the west nave wall with an elaborate limestone belicote accommodating 3 bells. The blocked north nave doorway has a semi-circular inner arch and reported by Historic England as being possibly Norman (1066-1071).
